FLICKERS' VORTEX SCI-FI, FANTASY, AND HORROR FILM FESTIVAL ANNOUNCES FILM AWARDS FOR 22nd SEASON

80+ films from 17 countries vied for adjudicated genre awards

PROVIDENCE, **RI** (October 24, 2021) – The 22nd Annual symphony of international genre films were given their due with the wrap of the **Flickers' Vortex Sci-Fi**, **Fantasy**, **and Horror Film Festival** through adjudicated awards. The Festival celebrated and showcased imagination and creativity in filmmaking and included **14 World and United States Premieres**. In all, **80+ films** were selected from over 3,000 genre submissions, representing 16 countries. This year's Festival was planned, developed and curated by **Shawn Drywa**, Vortex Program Director and creator of the annual genre Festival in collaboration with **Shawn Quirk**, Program Director of the Rhode Island International Film Festival (RIIFF).

The 2021 Vortex Festival was a hybrid event with programming appearing online and select screenings at the Rustic Tri-View Drive-in in North Smithfield, Rhode Island. Webinars, forums, the popular, and sold-out, Lovecraft Walking Tour with the Rhode Island Historical Society, filmmaker interviews, and post film screening Q&A's composed this year's events. The 2021 Festival continued popular annual programs "Virtually," including a special episode of the Flickers' series "doubleFEATURE" that aired on Rhode Island PBS.

With the bracing Fall weather, the seasonal return of the **H.P. Lovecraft Walking Tour** could not have been timelier. The Tour, presented in collaboration with the **Rhode Island Historical Society**, took place over four days during the Festival. Once announced, it guickly sold out.

"It's an amazing achievement that we are celebrating our 22nd anniversary this year. The decision in 2015 to expand our programming with sci-fi and fantasy films, along with our traditional horror film entries, has allowed us to create a showcase of truly unique films" said **Shawn Drywa**, Vortex Program Director.

"Our second year of pivoting to a hybrid program due to COVID and the Delta Variant, once again allowed for virtual and in-person events making it possible for this year's Vortex Film Festival to expand its offerings and engage audiences across the globe," noted **Shawn Quirk**, RIIFF's Program Director.

The Flickers' Rhode Island International Film Festival (RIIFF), has secured its place in the global community as the portal for the best international independent cinema, earning the respect of domestic and foreign filmmakers, filmgoers and trend watchers. This confluence of art and commerce brought together world-class celebrities, award-winning filmmakers, new talent and audience members in record numbers last year. Ranked as one of the top 10 Festivals in the United States, RIIFF is a qualifying festival for the Live Action, Animation and Documentary Short Film Academy Awards through its affiliation with the Academy of Motion Picture Arts & Sciences and the British Academy of Film and Television Arts (BAFTA). There are only 10 film festivals worldwide that share this distinction and RIIFF is the only festival in New England. The Festival takes place every August.
